



Martyn Lewis CBE

Martyn Lewis, one of Britain's best-known broadcasters, is Chairman and Founder of YouthNet. A television journalist for 34 years, he has, during that time, presented every mainstream national TV news programme on ITV and the BBC. He also chairs the Beacon Fellowship Trust, a charity set up to encourage individual contributions to charitable and social causes and is closely involved with the Hospice movement. He is also the President of United Response and a trustee of the Windsor Leadership Trust. Martyn is also an author and holds an honorary Doctor of Letters from the University of Ulster, is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, and a Freeman of the City of London. He was awarded a CBE in 1997.
